This flier is to draw your attention to units in human geography that you might find interesting to do alongside your history studies. Since Macquarie University was established, many students have combined history and human geography in their degrees and the two disciplines tie in neatly with each other.

In human geography you will find the following study pathways:

- Population, social, cultural geography,
- Economic geography,
- Development geography,
- Resource and environmental management,
- Geographic information systems.

Several of the units in these strands have historical components: e.g. population history, the historical development of Australia's economy, urban history and heritage issues. Units of particular relevance to history students are:
